Sharing these reports and information encourages consistency in strategies between home and school which support students learning. Updated reports can be given to your child's teacher, brought into the front office or emailed to me on leanne.jacobs929@schools.sa.edu.au.

One Plan meetings will be arranged in the near future. If you would like any members of your child's NDIS/ support team to be involved in these meetings please let your child's teacher or myself know. Meetings involving Non Education Service Providers can be held in person or via Teams.

Non Education Service Providers/ Therapy Sessions

As a site we do not provide for therapy sessions by Non Education Service Providers to be held on site. We are happy to engage in meetings to discuss goals and strategies with therapists and families as we value the team around the child approach to ensure there is consistency between home and school. We are flexible in understanding that parents may need to drop their child off late or pick them up early to enable sessions to be held at home or in therapy offices.

Engagement for Learning

My name is Ellen Barr, and I am excited to serve as the Curriculum Leader for the upcoming school year. I am dedicated to fostering an engaging, supportive and nurturing learning environment where students can play, grow and take risks in their learning. I look forward to getting to know both you and your child as we collaborate throughout the year.

Part of my role at the school is ensuring that we provide relevant and engaging educational experiences enabling all students to become effective learners in English and Mathematics.



English

We support students in learning phonics through the 'Read, Write Inc.' program which is a systematic and structured approach used globally to build strong foundational literacy skills. The program emphasises phonics teaching through sequenced lessons with engaging activities.

Some of the programs many benefits are:

- -It effectively monitors student growth in reading
- -It identifies gaps and provides immediate support
- -It caters to diverse individual needs by allowing students to progress through groups as their current rate of learning

Our goal is for students to read independently and after that happens we focus on enhancing their comprehension, spelling, and writing skills. We believe Read Write Inc. equips students with the literacy skills necessary for academic success and fosters a lifelong love of reading and writing.

Mathematics

This year we are fortunate to collaborate again with Maureen Hegarty, a mathematics consultant. Maureen will work closely with teachers to develop learning sequences that will extend students' mathematical thinkina through hands-on, authentic learning experiences. Our goal by the end of 2025 is to develop a consistent whole-school approach to teaching mathematics and a Mathematics Agreement.

Kitchen/Garden

Our wonderful Kitchen/Garden program will continue this year with Alicia as our Kitchen specialist and JP as our Garden specialist. Students throughout the year will learn to cook a variety of foods such as lentil curries, apple crumble and carrot muffins. Students last year were even brave enough to try green ants, caviar and oysters!

2025 is shaping up to be another big year for students and staff at Christie Downs Primary School.

Dream Believe Achieve Parliament

I am excited to announce that this year we will have a Student Parliament. Student Parliament will be a genuine decision making body for students. Students will have a genuine voice as outlined in **Article 12** of the **UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.**

Our Student Parliament will be called the **Dream Believe Achieve Parliament**. Every student and Educator will vote for a **Student Prime Minister**. The Student Prime Minister will be selected from the Year 6 senior cohort and will be responsible for leading the Parliament and liaising with the Ministries, Governing Council and our Principal.

Berry Street Education Model

The **Berry Street Education Model** is embedded into our teaching practice. We have adapted Berry Street strategies to address student needs for healing, growth and achievement. All Educators have been trained in the Berry Street Education Model. New Educators to our school will be

supported in Berry Street strategies to support our students. Here are some strategies that we have put into place:

Each class has their <u>morning greeting</u> on the classroom door. This might include a fist bump, a high 5, a hand shake, a dance, or a 'hello', just to name a few.

Circle Time

Students are welcomed into the classroom every morning by their Educator or student leader. Classes start the day with Circle Time.

Circle Time is a positive and fun start to every day.

Students stand in a circle in their classroom and work through the list below.

Greeting (high 5, handshake, smile, fist pump)

Positive Primer (quick game, funny YouTube video/song/dance)

Values/Expectations (talk about school values, attendance and behaviour)


Announcements (including birthdays, special events, school news)

WWW (What Went Well-during break times and during learning times)
Educators also take part in Circle Time at the beginning of staff meetings and

training and development days.

Classes will also be having **Brain Breaks** throughout the day.

Brain breaks are short, energised bursts of activity that boost blood flow, send oxygen to the brain, and help students better retain information. Brain breaks can also be relaxing, quiet activities that can have similar benefits. Brain breaks also reduce stress and anxiety, making it easier to focus on important tasks. Ask your child about what brain breaks they did throughout the day!

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is open every day and is located in our gym. Huge thanks to JP for running such a great Breakfast Club. Head down to the gym from 8:15 every morning and grad a bite to eat!

Attendance

Going to school on time every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school, every day.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school on time each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school. It's important that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school. Remember, Every Day Counts!

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom Educator know, or pop in and see me so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
