Spanish classes are buzzing with excitement this year as students embrace online learning to reinforce their lessons. Many of our larger classes have had the opportunity to enhance their learning through LanguageNut, an engaging online language program. Students are enjoying exploring Spanish across a range of topics, building their skills in a fun and interactive way.

Where possible, we incorporate literacy genres into our Spanish lessons to strengthen connections with what students are already learning in their literacy sessions. This approach helps reinforce key concepts and supports language development in both English and Spanish.

This term, students in our large classes are exploring the topics Mi aspecto (my appearance) and farm animals. Meanwhile, students in our small classes are engaging in highly structured activities tailored to their needs. We've introduced additional tasks to both challenge and support their learning journey. We encourage students to adopt a growth mindset by using phrases like "I can do tricky things," helping them develop perseverance and confidence in their abilities.
